

Why?

This is a great activity to pair with many of the presentations like: "Building empathy", "Self-image", and many of the intersectionality topics. Many of us "know" each other within a club or group, but do we really know someone? This activity takes this concept deeper and also allows for students to take the time to build others up.

How To

- Materials: construction paper, writing/coloring materials, optional: students bring a picture of themselves printed out.
- Have each student paste/draw a picture of themselves on a piece of paper.
- Around the picture, they are to write words/phrases/statements that describe them. (physical traits, identity, how they think of themself both positive and negative) "I am ____."
- Take turns, as you come to each person, the rest of the group takes time to share positive words/phrases that describes that person. The person being described writes these down on their own paper. "You are ____."

Tips

- Wait to do this activity until later in the year when your club members know each other better.
- If time allows afterwards, the student can discuss how each one realtes to them (small groups or whole group).

Timeline

Can be done closer to the time, but give heads up if you want students to bring a picture with them.
